Pentecost, the 50th day after Easter, recalls the account in Acts 2 of the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples, giving them a new boldness in sharing the good news of Jesus and his resurrection.

St. Barnabas Hosts Families Moving Forward July 2-9



Beginning Sunday, July 2, St. Barnabas will host the first week of guests in the *Families Moving Forward* ministry.

These parents and children are homeless. We can't sugar coat that! Every week they go to a different church, not knowing what kind of beds they will sleep in, what food they will be served, and what kind of people will greet them. It's difficult to imagine those circumstances.

These families have chosen to be part of this program, and the Beacon Interfaith Housing staff has vetted the families to ensure that they fit the criteria for the program. The adults either have jobs, or are seeking employment during their stay, but do not yet have enough money for permanent housing. Some of these adults go to work during the day; others go to the Beacon office to get help in looking for employment. Until they are able to find a job and afford permanent housing, they go to a different host church week where they can sleep safely, eat healthy meals, and hopefully find some respite from the stress of their situation.

We strive to make our guests feel welcome and cared for. To accomplish that, we need many volunteers. Below are listed some of the volunteer jobs that we need to fill.

- Help set up and serve the evening meal, and sit down with our guests to share the meal.
- Help set up the bedroom on the lower level. This involves inflating the air mattresses and making up the beds with sheets, blankets, pillow, etc. In general, we want to

make their rooms as comfortable as possible.

- We need one person each night to serve as the overnight host in case there are any special needs or emergencies during the night. We have not had any emergencies in the previous two years, but we need to have someone there just in case.
- Activity hosts: We need people to come during the early evening to play games and lead activities with the kids.
- Donate items. We could use such things as: art supplies, G-rated DVDs, kids books, and balls that can be used outside for games.

Our guests will be here every day starting July 2 through Sunday morning, July 9. We hope that many of you will find something on this list that fits for you. We want the week these people spend at St. Barnabas to be safe, enjoyable, and welcoming. Those of us who have done this the previous two years have found it to be both a challenging and rewarding volunteer experience.

Please join us in this unique opportunity to meet and spend time with some of God's people who we rarely interact with in our daily lives. There are sign up sheets at the Welcome Center to volunteer for a job that fits you. If you are unavailable during the week of July 2-9, we will need the same volunteer help during our second host week of August 13-20.

Summer Worship Focuses on Romans

In recent years there has been a trend for cities and/or colleges to announce a goal of having every citizen/student read the same book as a way of spurring discussion and promoting a sense of community.

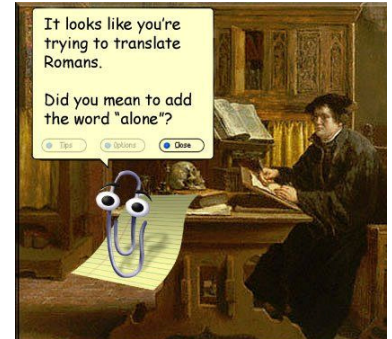
This summer, Paul's *Letter to the Romans* will be the "reading in common" book for the St. Barnabas community. In this year when we mark the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation, this is an especially appropriate choice since *Romans* was one of the key Biblical books that helped form Martin Luther's understanding of God's grace and that our relationship with God is not based on what we do, but based simply on trusting God's promises.

Pastor Wayne and Pastor Amber will preach on texts from *Romans* each weekend in June,

July, and August. In addition, the *Church Begins at Home* devotional materials will give all the opportunity to read the entire letter by reading a chapter or two each week. For those who are available on Tuesday mornings from 9:15-10:30, the Pastor's Bible Study will look at *Romans* in greater detail.

It is hoped that even though vacations or sports tournaments may keep us from worshipping together regularly, this common activity of reading *Romans* will bind us together as a community.

Copies of all the *Romans* sermons will be available in the narthex and online for those who wish to read sermons from Sundays when they are out of town.



Council Information Meetings on June 3/4 Present Plans for Solar Panels

St. Barnabas first began conversations with Sundial Solar in August, 2015 about the possibility of installing solar panels on the roof of the church. The two-fold reason for doing this is 1) to save the congregation money by producing the majority of the electricity it uses and 2) to be good stewards of God's creation by reducing our dependence on non-renewable resources.

We learned that there are great state and utility incentives available in Minnesota. However, those appealing incentives do not apply to nonprofits such as churches because they pay no tax against which to apply the credits.

Sundial Solar has been searching for a way to satisfy the IRS requirements about active and passive income and credits. They have now located an investor who is involved in the solar energy business who is able to take the credits and is willing to finance the solar panel projects of several congregations.

The Church Council heard a presentation about this possibility by Aric Sorenson of Sundial Solar at his retreat on April 22. The investor is offering two Power Purchase Agreement options:

- a **long term agreement** in which the investor would own the system for 25 years, which would have estimated cumulative savings of \$56,000 (a little over \$2000/year on average)
- a **short term agreement** in which the investor would own the system for six years to receive the tax credits and depreciation and then sell the system to the congregation at fair market value, estimated to be 40% of the installation price. This short term option would have estimated cumulative savings of \$187,000 over 25 years (a little over \$7,000/year on average).

Members of the Church Council will offer information meetings about the solar panel project after worship services on June 3 and 4.

- 18 people participated in a planning retreat June 12-13 at Peace Lutheran Church. The group crafted a mission statement for the new congregation and identified five ministry goals.
- The Service Committee met on June 30 with Pastor Ron Peterson, assistant to the bishop of the Minnesota Synod, to begin work on a constitution.
- Pastor Wayne officiated at two weddings in June — **Jodi Wilson & Mike Fisher** on June 26 and **Crystal Pasic & Ted Messmore** on June 27.
- Pastor Wayne made 85 initial calls and 7 cultivation (2nd time) calls.
- Attendance for May averaged 36. Total offerings for the month: \$879. 229 households on prospective membership list.

- **ushers** to hand out bulletins and receive the offering
- **lectors** to read the scripture reading
- **assisting ministers** to lead the prayers and help distribute communion
- **crucifers**, our high school students who carry the processional cross and help distribute communion
- **offering counters** -- two people count the offering following the 2nd worship service
- **coffee bakers** who provide the treats after worship
- **coffee hosts** who serve the food and clean up

Sign up to serve online

This summer we are experimenting with using Google Docs as a way for people to sign up online. When you receive the e-newsletter each week, look at the "Quick Links" section in the right side bar and you will find links to the schedules for all of the tasks listed above.

Click on those links and you will access a Google Doc on which you can fill your name in on the Sunday(s) you wish to serve. The document will be saved automatically when you exit.
